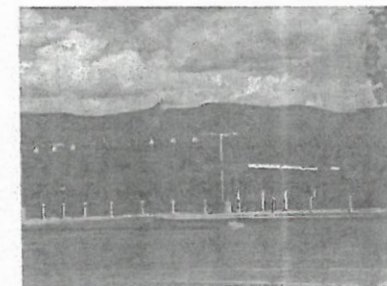

Our Goals for Student Achievement

District Goals

The Taos Municipal Schools sets goals for the entire district. The district goals for 2018-2019 are:

Reading - all students will show a 15% increase in reading proficiency as measured by State PARCC test.

Math - all students will show a 15% increase in mathematics as measured by State PARCC test.

TAOS HIGH SCHOOL'S GOALS

Taos High School's Leadership Team studied our student performance data to decide on the most important areas of improvement for our school.

Reading - To increase reading proficiency by 10% over three years. Our school will concentrate on the following areas:

- Create literature-based units of exploration
- Organize Emotional Intelligence activities for students.
- Offer literature based reading and writing assignments aligned with Common Core Standards.

Math - To increase math proficiency by 10% over three years. Our school will concentrate on the following areas:

- Students will reach target scores based on short cycle assessments.
- Common Core Standards and Math Practices will guide our curriculum.
- Utilize Learning Targets to aid students with accountability and proficiency.
